The main objectives of PDM are on promoting continuous education, research and collaboration and advocacy role. I would like to elaborate further on PDM's commitments for the next two years.

**Collaboration** – I am proud to mention that PDM members had actively participated as speakers at The World Congress of Dermatology 2023 (WCD23) held in Singapore this year. There was a total 20 PDM members involved as speakers and I am delighted to see young dermatologists delivering excellent and of high quality presentations. Congratulations to all! PDM was given a platform at WCD23 to present **highlights from Malaysia**. Dato Dr. Noor Zalmy Azizan and myself chaired an one-hour session. We had three speakers, Associate Professor Adawiyah Abd Jamil, Dr. Leong Kin Fon and Dr. Suganthi Robinson sharing their experience on the following topics "Atopic Dermatitis in the Sunny Sunshine", "20 years of Gene Hunting in Malaysia" and "Malaysian Psoriasis Registry – The Journey So Far" respectively.

The PDM will be hosting the **26<sup>th</sup> Regional Conference of Dermatology (RCD)** in year 2024. The venue will be Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre and it will be an exciting conference in view of the fact that the PDM will be collaborating with The Chapter of Dermatology, Academy of Malaysia, Asian Society of Dermatopathology, Asian Academy of Dermatology and Venereology and Asian Society of Pigment Cell Research. This partnership will have a greater influence and allure more delegates! We have lined up exciting talks with leading experts from the Asia Pacific and around the globe.

As the President of the PDM, I was privileged to attend the ILDS Ordinary Annual General Meeting, Assembly of Delegates at the 25<sup>th</sup> WCD23 Singapore. This AGM was attended by 190-member dermatological societies representing 220,000 dermatologist

worldwide. I participated in the election of Regional Directors for the Board of ILDS and voted for the next city hosting 26<sup>th</sup> WCD! It was a memorable experience for me.

**Education** – The PDM has been actively organising dermatology updates and seminars for members both physically and virtually, and I firmly believe this new-age way of knowledge transfer will stay on. The PDM with Pharmaceutical collaboration have organised many virtual seminars, and to share a few topics here like, Psoriasis Masterclass, Shrinking the Psoriasis Assessment Gap: the evidence of gene-expression profiling to guide practice pathways and expert consensus on holistic skin care routine. The PDM's website (dermatology.org.my) has been actively visited by members. It has the 'members only' section where society activities, announcements, current issues, guidelines, protocols, and slides on scientific meetings are shared. Members are encouraged to access our website.

The Dermatology Chapter under the leadership of Dr Henry Foong has been diligently conducting continuous medical education through webinars and conferences. The Dermatology Chapter had organised the **5<sup>th</sup> Annual Scientific Meeting** on the 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> April 2023, incorporating the **PDM Mid-term meeting** at Hospital Tunku Azizah Kuala Lumpur. The theme was Cutting Edge Dermatology and had very renowned speakers like Professor Rox Anderson (Harvard Medical School), Associate Professor Jeffery S. Dover (Yale Medical School), Dr. Richard Barlow (St John's Institute of Dermatology) and Dr. Yulianto Listiawan (President of Indonesia Dermatology & Venereology).

**Research** – The PDM supports research among its members and have established the PDM research grant to encourage research in the field of dermatology. This year the PDM had received six applications for PDM grant and three proposal have been approved while the other three are still under the review of the Research Committee.

As the Dermatology fraternity gets larger, the PDM, together with the **Malaysian Skin Foundation (MSF)** started in 2022 to promote and support more research through MSF grant for dermatologists.

The PDM commemorates 35 years of **Malaysian Journal of Dermatology (MJD)** publication. The first MJD was published in year 1988 as hardcopy and the first founding editor was Dr. Steven Chow Kim Weng. Since 2007, MJD has been regularly publishing online. With more research, I hope that members, especially the trainees of the Advanced Masters in Dermatology would publish their dissertation work in the MJD to enhance the impact factor of the journal and qualify it to be indexed in the near future.

**Paediatric Dermatology Sub Committee** – The Paediatric Dermatology sub committee have been officially established to enhance the training, education, advocating skin health for children and strengthen paediatric dermatology national and international collaboration.

### Advocacy Programme

The PDM is also committed in raising public awareness regarding skin health and skin diseases. The PDM will be organising **National Skin Health Day** on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2023 at The Berjaya Times Square Shopping Complex and the event will be packed with exciting activities for public like mole check, counselling for general skin care including important health facts on acne, eczema and psoriasis. The Executive Committee members actively participated in educating public on common skin disorders and skin care through writing articles in mainstream media.

Lastly, I hope that we will continue to work together for the advancement of Dermatology for us, for our patients, our community and our nation. On behalf of all the Executive Committee members, I would like to thank everyone for your continuous support and encouragement throughout this year.

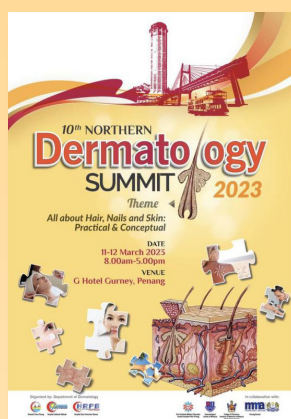




# 10<sup>th</sup> Northern Dermatology Summit 2023

# CONTACT DERMATITIS AND CUTANEOUS ALLERGY UPDATE 2023, HOSPITAL SELAYANG

On 21<sup>st</sup> May 2023, the Dermatology Department of Hospital Selayang orchestrated the “Contact Dermatitis and Cutaneous Allergy Update 2023” at the Hospital Selayang Auditorium. Conceived with the core aim to disseminate the latest advancements in contact dermatitis and to hone practical skills related to its management, the event accomplished these objectives splendidly.

A testament to the course’s success was the impressive turnout of 147 participants, spanning dermatologists, dermatology fellows, medical officers, staff nurses, and paramedics. The day unfolded in a meticulously coordinated series of lectures delivered by revered experts in the field.

1. Dr. Teeba Raja outlined the elementary principles and pathophysiology of contact dermatitis
2. Dr. Leong Kin Fon delineated an approach to contact dermatitis within paediatric groups
3. Dr. Sharifah Rosniza not only elaborated on the standard and extended patch tests series in Malaysia but also enlightened the attendees on the latest developments in the European standard series
4. Dr. Teh Yeon Chiat elucidated the conundrum of cutaneous drug hypersensitivity
5. Dr. How Kang Nien took the audience through the intricate nuances of occupational contact dermatitis
6. Dr. Elizabeth Chang Wei Hsi navigated through the evolution of contact allergens from 2000 to the present, culminating with an outlook on emerging trends



Dr. Teeba Raja (Head of Dermatology Selayang and chairperson of the event), presented a token of appreciation to Dr. Sharifah Rosniza, who gave a keynote lecture on patch testing at a dermatology masterclass. - Station 2: Executing Repeat Open Application Test, Use Test, As is, Semi-open and Open Patch Tests, ably guided by Dr. Darshini Chandrasakaranpillay & Dr Teh Yih Heng
- Station 3: Dilution of Wash-off Allergens, led by the expert duo, Dr. Mazliha Mashor & Dr. Ishvant Sidhu
- Station 4: Photo-testing and photo patch-testing, conducted by Dr. Azila Akil, Dr. Teoh Xin Yun & Physiotherapist Raden Khursiah
- Station 5: Skin Prick Tests, managed by Dr. Siti Nuraihan Nordin & Dr. Kanimoli Rathakrishnan
- Station 6: Skin Prick and Intradermal Drug Tests demonstrated by Dr. Teh Yeon Chiat & Dr Zareen Yahya

Keeping the enthusiasm alive, a competitive and riveting quiz session ensued. The ultimate victors were Dr. Ting Yen Loo - first place, Dr. Jason Wong Lok Chin - runner up, and the third place going to Dr. Lim Mong Wayne.

# 1<sup>ST</sup> NATIONAL DERMATOLOGY- RHEUMATOLOGY MASTERCLASS, HOSPITAL SELAYANG

Dermatologists and rheumatologists frequently collaborate to address a spectrum of conditions impacting both the skin and joints, including psoriasis, lupus erythematosus, dermatomyositis, vasculitis, scleroderma, rheumatoid arthritis, and various others. This underscores the vital significance of their partnership, enabling early diagnoses and facilitating a comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach to patient care.

With this principle in mind, the Departments of Dermatology and Rheumatology at Hospital Selayang jointly organized the "1<sup>st</sup> National Dermatology-Rheumatology Masterclass 2023" on August 5th, 2023. This event proved immensely beneficial for aspiring dermatologists and rheumatologists, physicians, medical officers, staff nurses and paramedics across the nation, attracting a total of 164 participants who engaged in a full-day program.

The masterclass was thoughtfully structured to make it more interactive. In the morning, three sessions covered rheumatology and dermatology aspects of lupus erythematosus, dermatomyositis, and psoriasis. Knowledgeable speakers from each field shared insights, followed by engaging case presentations and panel discussions. In the afternoon, there was an interactive vasculitis session featuring case-based learning and intriguing quizzes. This was followed by expert-delivered lectures on scleroderma and a workshop focusing on the use of capillaroscopes and dermatoscopes to identify nail capillary changes in dermatomyositis and lupus erythematosus. Additionally, certified rheumatologists provided instruction on performing Rodnan scoring.

This masterclass exemplified the fruitful partnership between dermatologists and rheumatologists, demonstrating its pivotal role in advancing medical knowledge and improving patient outcomes.

## Fellowship in Mohs and Advanced Dermatological Surgery in St John's Institute of Dermatology, London, United Kingdom

Mohs micrographic surgery (MMS) is the gold standard treatment for high-risk non-melanoma skin cancers particularly basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma. Besides offering superior cure rates, tissue-sparing benefits are useful for cosmetically sensitive areas. I was fortunate to be offered an opportunity to pursue my fellowship training in St John's Institute of Dermatology at Guy's Hospital, London, United Kingdom under the supervision of Dr Raj Mallipeddi. Dr Mallipeddi is a consultant dermatologist and dermatological surgeon who is the lead clinician at the Dermatological Surgery and Laser Unit (DSLU) at St John's Institute of Dermatology.

I spent a year in London from May 2021 to April 2022 learning and refining various techniques in Mohs micrographic surgery, dermatological surgery and nail biopsy. As part of the fellowship requirements, I was able to participate in and perform more than 500 cases of Mohs micrographic surgery and more than 400 cases of reconstructions including flaps and full-thickness skin grafts.

During the fellowship, there was also exposure to laser procedures, photodynamic therapy as well as botulinum toxin injections for axillary hyperhidrosis and cosmetic indications. Furthermore, I had the opportunity to be involved in various educational and research activities including participation in multidisciplinary skin cancer meetings.

The fellowship was a truly educational and enlightening experience. I particularly cherish the friendships and working relationships forged during my stint. Moving forward, I hope to continue developing the Mohs micrographic service in Malaysia as well as contribute to educational efforts in dermatological surgery locally.

Lastly, I would like to thank my team at the University of Malaya Medical Centre for their support as well as the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya for the opportunity to pursue my training abroad.



## Malaysian Psoriasis Registry 2023

The Malaysian Psoriasis Registry (MPR) currently has over 30290 psoriasis patients registered in its database.

### MPR activities for 2022/2023:

1. At present, a total of 40 centers contribute data to the registry which include 36 government centres, 2 private centres and 2 universities. University and private dermatologists are strongly encouraged to contribute so that the registry may accurately represent psoriasis patients in Malaysia.
2. Notifications for all psoriasis patients are done once and six monthly thereafter for those on phototherapy and systemic treatment.
3. Registration forms to register as users are available at <http://www.dermatology.org.my/DermReg/sdp.html>. All dermatologists with institutional e-mails are eligible to register. As a registered user, you would be able to perform data entry and download data for your center.
4. We have published 1 annual reports, 6 manuscripts in peer reviewed journals and presented 6 abstracts and posters at local and international conferences. These publications are available at <http://www.dermatology.org.my/DermReg/publications.html>.

The first MJD was published in year 1988 as hardcopy and the first founding editor was Dr. Steven Chow Kim Weng. It is being listed in the WHO western pacific region Index Medicus, (WPRIM) since 1994. Since 2007, MJD has been regularly publishing online. Currently, MJD is published twice a year (June & December issues).

We believe being Malaysian is our unique niche- multi-ethnic, diversity of cultures, traditions & climates; our priority will be for scientific knowledge about dermatological diseases found in Malaysia and for the practice of dermatology being medical or cosmetic in Malaysia.

The editorial columns will always try to reflect the society's views and attitudes towards dermatology problems in the country. The MJD will also archive knowledge about the changing pattern of skin diseases both medical & surgical, advances of the understanding, management, treatment of skin diseases and our endeavours to them

We seek articles that are of educational value to doctors. We will consider all unsolicited articles submitted to the journal and will publish genuine, precise & relevant review articles. During the past 1 year, the editorial board received 35 manuscripts for consideration of publication. The acceptance rate was 82.9%.

## Single Dose Rifampicin Chemoprophylaxis for Leprosy

The single-dose rifampicin (SDR) chemoprophylaxis programme for leprosy was first launched in Malaysia at Kampung Orang Asli Sawah Batu, Pekan, Pahang on 5th to 6th July 2022. This initiative continues to expand to other areas of Pahang in year 2023.

1. Leprosy active case detection (ACD) and post-exposure prophylaxis with single-dose rifampicin (PEP-SDR) program with JKN Pahang: Kampung Permatang Keledang on 1.2.23
2. Leprosy ACD and PEP-SDR program with JKN Pahang: Kampung Sawah Batu on 5-7.5.23
3. Leprosy ACD and PEP-SDR program with JKN Pahang: Kampung Sg Mok on 9-11.6.23



## Yaws Screening Campaign in Sungai Kejar Hulu Perak

Yaws is a long forgotten tropical skin infection caused by *Trepanoma Pallidum* subspecies *Pertenue* which mainly affects children in poor rural communities in tropical countries. In Malaysia, the history of campaign against yaws started in 1920 and a yaws elimination unit was formed in MOH in 1954 which eventually merged with the general health services when the rates was <2 per 100,000. Since then, the disease often goes unrecognised and misdiagnosed due to its rarity. In 2007, there was an aboriginal family with confirmed case of yaws in Sg Kejar, Hulu Perak and four of the family members (1 adult and 3 children) were treated with IM Benzathine penicillin. Subsequently many villagers in the same area were noted to have positive rapid treponemal test (RTT) during a routine health screening in 2022. This led to initiation of yaws screening campaign in the village followed by mass drug administration with Azithromycin to eliminate the infection among the villagers.

Mass yaws screening was carried out in Sg Kejar from July 2022 till October 2022 with collaboration between PKD Hulu Perak, JKN Perak and Dermatology department HRPB. Screening for active yaws lesions was done followed by RTT. Those with positive RTT will be subjected for RPR and TPPA if consented for blood taking. Tab Azithromycin 30mg per kg or 2 g stat was given to the villagers aged > 2 months old who were agreeable for the mass drug administration. A total of 158 villagers were screened with majority male (60%). There were 14 patients who refused RTT and for the remaining 144 villagers, 23% (36 patients) had positive RTT but only 23 patients had undergone confirmatory test with RPR and TPPA which was positive in all 23 cases. All these 36 RTT positive cases were adults and majority were asymptomatic consistent with latent yaws except one adult male patient who had crusted skin lesion with positive RTT but refused for RPR and TPPA. All 36 positive RTT cases were treated with oral Azithromycin. Amongst the 122 villagers who were RTT-negative or refused RTT, 82 received empirical oral Azithromycin while the remaining 40 refused oral Azithromycin.

Yaws is still existing in the current era and primary care physicians must have high index of suspicion when dealing with any patients in rural areas. Health education and mass screening for affected communities is crucial and prompt treatment must be advocated to eliminate it.

### MALAYSIAN SKIN FOUNDATION

#### DermaHope - The Hope that never fades

Shortly after its inception, Malaysian Skin Foundation (MSF) organised a **Patient Awareness Day** in conjunction with its **soft launch** at the main auditorium of Hospital Tunku Azizah Kuala Lumpur on 17 December 2022. The event was spearheaded by Dato Dr Noor Zalmy Azizan and her team. The objective of the campaign was to create awareness of the various life-affecting skin diseases such as psoriasis, eczema, hidradenitis suppurative and epidermolysis bullosa.

Dr Azura, Dr Benji, Dr Kartini and Dr Diedre gave a series of talks on these skin diseases while some of our trainees were involved in providing free skin consultation to the public. The various patient support groups such as Psoriasis Association of Malaysia, DEBRA Malaysia, Persatuan Ekzema Malaysia, PEKIM, Hidradenitis Suppurativa Support Group and Psoriasis Association of Johor were invited to witness the soft launch during which a small donation were given out to each of them as a token of encouragement for the work that they had done in supporting people afflicted by these diseases.



Between February to April 2023, MSF collaborated with the Public Relations students of Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR) Kampar, with the objective to introduce MSF to the public and to highlight the unmet healthcare needs of individuals who suffer from skin diseases. The students embarked on a social media campaign as well as roadshows which took them from Penang to Perak to Selangor to create awareness to the public. The students also interviewed a few patients who shared their experiences on coping with their skin diseases. The finale was a **Grand Launch cum Charity Dinner** held at Aloft Hotel on 29 April 2023.





MSF rolled out its Patient Assistance Programme (PAP) in April 2023, the purpose of which is to provide financial assistance to eligible individuals based on recommendation from their treating dermatologists. There was a total of 12 applicants between April to May 2023, out of which 11 were successful. The amount of financial assistance ranged from RM500 to RM1,000 per month for a period of 6 months, subjected to renewal for another 6 months.

MSF unveiled its dedicated website, accessible at [malaysianskinfoundation.org.my](http://malaysianskinfoundation.org.my), providing a comprehensive platform for the public to explore the foundation's objectives, vision, mission, and core values. Additionally, visitors can conveniently locate dermatologists, gain insights into prevalent skin conditions, and contribute through donation links.

Moving forward, MSF is actively seeking collaboration with young and mid-career dermatologists for impactful research endeavors. Dr. Moonyza Akmal Binti Ahmad Kamil, affiliated with the Department of Dermatology at Hospital Kuala Lumpur, is spearheading a multicenter study on biologics' survival in psoriasis. MSF is also inviting applications for research funding, thereby fostering a platform for innovative research within the realm of dermatology.





# CLINICAL PRACTICE GUIDELINES ON THE MANAGEMENT OF ACNE VULGARIS (2<sup>nd</sup> EDITION)

Acne vulgaris is a common skin disease. A common misconception by the public is that acne vulgaris is a self-limiting teenage skin problem and thus, does not warrant treatment. However, it has been found to adversely affect the patients' social life, self-esteem and body image. It also has the potential to cause scarring in some patients and may contribute to significant psychological distress, like depression and anxiety, if left untreated.

The first edition of Acne CPG was published in 2012. The rationale for developing the second edition is due to the rising prevalence and incidence of acne vulgaris and to standardize the management of acne vulgaris by healthcare professionals. Variation in practice in the management of acne vulgaris warrants an evidence-based guidelines to guide healthcare providers on the issue. This is especially so when cosmeceutical products can be easily bought over the counter by the patients, hence a chapter on cosmeceuticals was included in this updated edition. Advancement in the diagnosis and treatment in acne vulgaris necessitate related updates to be addressed in the new edition of the CPG. Thus, the updated version also addresses the latest treatment modalities in the management of acne vulgaris.

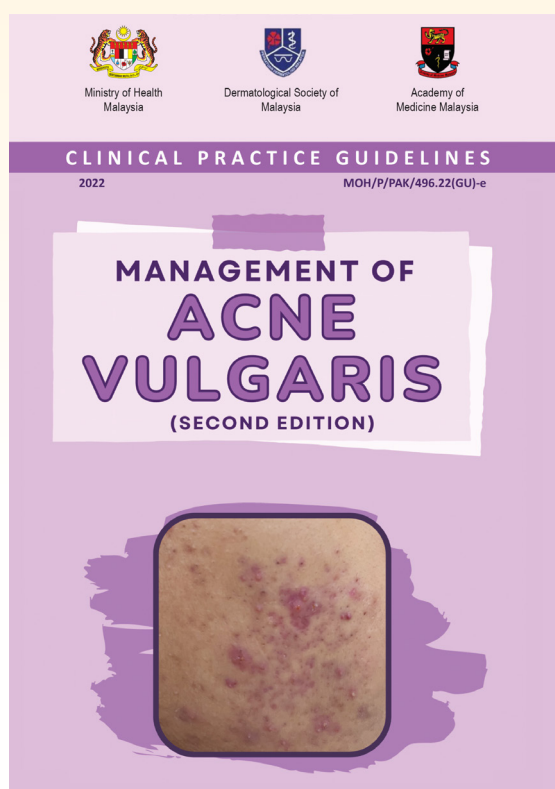
The members of the Development Group for the CPG were from the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Higher Education and private sector. There was active involvement of a multidisciplinary Review Committee during the process of the CPG development. The CPG was also reviewed externally by international and local experts in acne vulgaris. The development of the CPG was initially dampened when the Covid-19 pandemic hits, and eventually, after 3 years, the Second Edition of the CPG on the Management of Acne Vulgaris was finally published in 2022. Training of trainers was conducted on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023 at Institut Kanser Negara (IKN), Putrajaya. The event was attended by specialists and medical officers from all over Malaysia. The CPG was officially launched by Dr Azman Yacob, Director of Medical Development Division, Ministry of Health Malaysia on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2023 at IKN, Putrajaya. Since its publication, the CPG has been presented at various conferences, such as the 5th Annual Scientific Meeting of Dermatology Chapter on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2023 and Kelantan Dermatology Update on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

2nd Edition CPG on Management of Psoriasis Vulgaris : What’s coming?

The first Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) on the Management of Psoriasis Vulgaris in Malaysia was published in 2013. Since then, there have been many new developments in the therapeutic armamentarium of psoriasis vulgaris (PV) due to continually advancing knowledge of the pathophysiology of the disease and thus it is timely to revise our CPG. This second edition will update recommendations for managing PV based on the best and latest evidence available to provide evidence-based guidance to all healthcare providers involved in caring for patients with PV. The aim of this CPG is to assist clinicians and other healthcare providers in making evidence-based decisions on holistic management of PV. Treatment goals and recommendations will be stated to ensure that all patients receive appropriate and adequate care.

The new CPG development group consist multidisciplinary team of dermatologists (8), paediatric dermatologists (2), rheumatologists (2), family medicine specialists (2) and pharmacists (2). We are guided by Dr Mohd Aminuddin and Dr Nur Hanani from Malaysia Health Technology assessment Section (MAHTAS). Our review committees also consist of multidisciplinary team of dermatologists (4), family medicine specialists (2), rheumatologist (1), paediatric dermatologist (1), pharmacist (1) and patient advocate (1). We had our first meeting to discuss about the CPG protocol on 18/11/2022 and the protocol was then presented to the review committee on 14/2/23. After finalizing our protocol, the evidence was then retrieved systemically. We are currently in the stage of appraising all the evidence to produce evidence table.

In this new edition, we are going to redefine the definition of disease severity and determine the new treatment goal. In addition, we are going to relook into comorbidities, aggravating factors and risk factors of PV. All treatment modalities such as non-pharmacological treatment, topical therapy (including new small molecules eg phosphodiesterase inhibitor, januse kinase inhibitor inhibitor, aryl hydrocarbon receptor modulating agent), phototherapy, conventional systemic agent, biologics (TNF-alpha inhibitor, IL12/23 inhibitor, IL17 inhibitor, IL23 inhibitor and biosimilar), oral small molecules (januse kinase inhibitor, phosphodiesterase inhibitor) and combination therapy will be appraised in terms of their efficacy and safety in the management of PV. We are also going to look at the effective and safe treatment for special group of patients including paediatric and pregnant/ lactating mother with PV. The special groups will also include those with psoriatic arthritis, tuberculosis, viral hepatitis B & C, heart failure, chronic kidney disease, HIV or cancer. We will discuss about special considerations in PV patient on systemic/ biologics treatment requiring surgery or vaccination. The criteria to refer patients with PV to dermatological or rheumatological service or combined clinic will be determined to enable seamless care of patients with PV between hospital and community care.

Manual Pengurusan Kusta (MPK) 3rd edition  
Leprosy Treatment in Malaysia: An Update

The **Manual Pengurusan Kusta (MPK)** was recently revised and its 3rd edition (2023) outlines both treatment of leprosy in Malaysia as well as post-exposure management of contacts. The MPK is adapted from the World Health Organization (WHO) guidelines for the management of leprosy 2018. The new treatment regimen consists of rifampicin, clofazimine and dapsone for both pauci- and multi-bacillary leprosy:
