

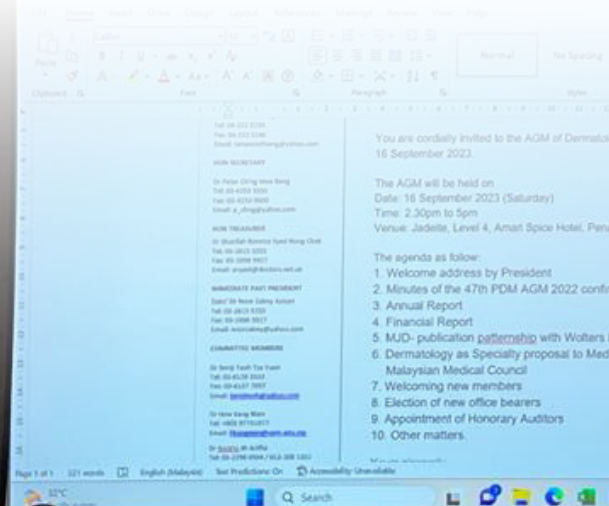
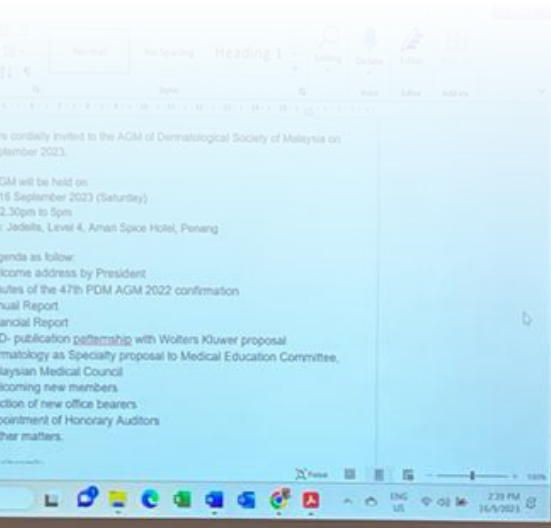

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Message from *President*

Dear Esteemed members, friends and colleagues,

I would like to express my gratitude for honouring this inspiring opportunity to lead Persatuan Dermatology Malaysia (PDM) for past two years (2022-2024). The time has passed quickly and my presidential role will end in September 2024. It was indeed a humble and proud privilege for me.

First, I would like to thank my Executive Committee (2022-2024) members for their unwavering support throughout my tenure. They were excellent and delivered to their fullest capabilities for the advancement of the society. My sincere appreciation to Past President Council for their guidance and expert advice and special thanks to Dato' Dr. Noor Zalmy Azizan as my reference person. And not to forget the dedicated secretariat, Ms Molly Kong and Mdm Margaret Choo, pillars of my term as president.

The highlight of my tenure is the 26th Regional Conference of Dermatology (RCD) that will be held on 2-5 October 2024. PDM is hosting this prestigious conference again after 14 years since the 19th RCD that was held on October 2010 at Sabah! The theme for 26th RCD this year is *"Medical & Cosmetic Dermatology - Global Panorama"* brilliantly led by Dr Tan Wooi Chiang, the Scientific Chairperson. The Scientific committee have laid out extensive topics covering medical dermatology, paediatric dermatology, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery and cosmetic dermatology with the cutting-edge science, innovative medical technology and up to date knowledge sharing at this conference with prominent international and local speakers. I would like to thank the 26th RCD Scientific Committee members for their endless effort to the success of this conference.

The main objectives of PDM are on promoting continuous education, research and advocacy role. I would like to elaborate further on PDM's achievements for the last two years.

COLLABORATION – INTERNATIONAL AND LOCAL

i) International Leagues of Dermatological Society (ILDS)

PDM members had actively participated as speakers at The World Congress of Dermatology 2023 (WCD23) at Singapore and we were proud to share the highlights from Malaysia. Prof Henry Lim, President of ILDS will be delivering a brief introductory lecture on ILDS at the 26th RCD and he is our keynote speaker at 26th RCD. Dr Peter Ch'ng, PDM H. Secretary and myself had attended ILDS AGM on 15 July 2024 on virtual platform. PDM members have also contributed articles and write-ups on advocating skin health on a global scale in the ILDS Newsletters (ILDS member initiatives Directory for both 2023/24). This year two articles were published titled, Empowering Families: A half-day Event For Children With Epidermolysis Bullosa And Their Caregivers by Dr. Nirmala P and Leprosy Chemoprophylaxis with Single-Dose Rifampicin in Pahang State, Malaysia by Dr. Rajalingam Ramalingam.

ii) Leagues of Asian Dermatological Societies (LADS)

PDM will be hosting the 26th RCD at Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC) from 2-5 October 2024. LADS Annual General Meeting will be held at KLCC on 4 October 2024 and will be represented by all the seven Asian Dermatological Societies from Singapore, Thailand, The Philippines, Indonesia, Cambodia and Vietnam.

iii) Skin Inflammation & Psoriasis International Network (SPIN) and International Rare And Severe Psoriasis Expert Network (IRASPEN)

PDM actively participate through **National Psoriasis Registry** on these international networks for professionals and patients on chronic inflammatory skin diseases, sharing educational recourses and learning from experts in the field of chronic inflammatory skin diseases especially psoriasis.

iv) FAADV Dermatopathology Exam

PDM collaborates with Asian Academy of Dermatology & Venerology and Asian Society of Dermatopathology in organising the FAADV Dermatopathology examination. The 7th FAADV Dermopath exam will be

held on 5 October 2024 at Hospital Kuala Lumpur.

v) Dermatology Chapter, College of Physician Academy of Medicine

PDM has continuous patronage with Dermatology Chapter COPAMM both in education and other CME activities. Last year, PDM with AMM and Past President Council had formed a special technical working group to work on upgrading Dermatology as a Specialty proposal to Malaysian Medical Council. With the recent amendment of Medical Law, we anticipate for more opportunities to explore and to promote this noble proposal.

EDUCATION

PDM extends unwavering support to the national training programme in Dermatology, the Advanced Master in Dermatology University Kebangsaan Malaysia. PDM members had organised many teaching activities for trainees under Advanced Masters in Dermatology, e.g. Intensive course for Advanced Masters of Dermatology. PDM collaborated with Ministry of Health to conduct workshops on Leprosy, STI, Wound and Scar management, Vascular anomalies, Dermatology Nursing workshop and Fellowship training experiences. Past two years PDM has collaborated with Rheumatology Sub specialty to organise Dermatology-Rheumatology Masterclass and this programs was spearheaded by Dr. Teeba Raja, PDM exco member.

The PDM with Pharmaceutical collaboration have organised many virtual seminars, and to share a few topics here like, Psoriasis Masterclass, Shrinking the Psoriasis Assessment Gap: the evidence of gene-expression profiling to guide practice pathways and expert consensus on holistic skin care routine. State dermatologists had organised Dermatology Updates for Medical Officers and paramedics at their respective states. The PDM's website (dermatology.org.my) has been actively visited by members. It has the 'members only' section where society activities, announcements, current issues, guidelines, protocols, and slides on scientific meetings are shared. Members are encouraged to access our website.

RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION

We are proud to announce that the Malaysian Journal of Dermatology is now an indexed journal, with assistance from the Wolters Kluwer Medknow. Hope this advancement will encourage the interest among members and trainees for publication submission. PDM would like to thank you Associate Prof Kwan Zhenli, Chief Editor of Malaysian Journal of Dermatology for her contribution in achieving this noble milestone. As the Dermatology fraternity gets larger, the PDM, together with the **Malaysian Skin Foundation (MSF)** started in 2022 to promote and support more research through MSF grant for dermatologists.

Paediatric Dermatology Sub Committee

The Paediatric Dermatology sub committee have been officially established to enhance the training, education, advocating skin health for children and strengthen paediatric dermatology national and international collaboration.

ADVOCACY PROGRAMME

The PDM is also committed in raising public awareness regarding skin health and skin diseases. PDM organises National Skin Health Day every year and this year it was held at Tasik Titivangsa, Kuala Lumpur on 28 July 2024 and was officiated by Pengarah Hospital Kuala Lumpur Dato' Dr. Hari Krishna KR Nair. The event started with Zumba session followed by 3 km Fun-Run and was packed with exciting activities for public like mole check, counselling for general skin care including important health facts on acne, eczema and psoriasis. The members also contribute to patient and parents' education and patient support groups. The Paediatric Dermatologist organised one-day workshop on wound and oral care for children with Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB). Other patient support activities include celebration of World Psoriasis Day, World Eczema Day and outreach programs for Leprosy and psoriasis. The Executive Committee members also actively participated in educating public on common skin disorders and skin care through writing articles in mainstream media.

Lastly, I hope that we will continue to work together for the advancement of Dermatology for us, for our patients, our community and our nation. On behalf of all the Executive Committee members, I would like to thank everyone for your continuous support and encouragement throughout these two years.

One hundred and twenty-six (126) students have graduated from the AdvMDerm programme since inception in 2022. Thirty eight (38) are currently undergoing their training. Fourteen are in their final year and will be sitting for their examination in June 2025. There are 10 candidates in the Dec 2022 – Dec 2025 batch, 6 in the June 2023 – June 2026 batch and another 8 in the Dec 2023 – Dec 2026 batch.

Paediatric Dermatology Subspecialty Training Programme in Malaysia

The paediatric dermatology subspecialty training programme was established in Malaysia more than 20 years ago and since then 14 paediatric dermatologists registered with the National Specialist Register (NSR) in Malaysia has successfully undergone training in this program. The programme is headed by Dr. SABEERA BEGUM BINTI KADER IBRAHIM who is also the head of Paediatric services in the Ministry of Health Malaysia.

The paediatric dermatology subspecialty training programme in Malaysia is an active clinical programme that consists of 2 years local training and one year overseas. For the local training, the first year will be conducted in a recognised state training hospital with resident paediatric dermatologist qualified to train or in a recognised tertiary center (Hospital Tunku Azizah). The second year is conducted in a recognised tertiary center (Hospital Tunku Azizah). The third year is usually completed overseas. The paediatric dermatology fellows have been trained in many parts of the world including Germany, UK, Australia, Taiwan, South Korea amongst others.

To enrol in the programme, a prospective candidate needs to be equipped with a basic medical degree which is recognized by the Malaysian Medical Council and a postgraduate qualification in paediatric medicine registrable under the category of General Paediatrics in the National Specialist Register(NSR) in Malaysia. He or she must have completed one year of service following gazettement as a general paediatrician and obtained a letter of recommendation from his or her superior.

Paediatric dermatology fellows are expected to learn how to manage dermatologic conditions in pediatric patients, from neonates to adolescents, under the supervision of experienced paediatric dermatologists. They will undergo a holistic educational experience with learning through a combination of the following: one-to-one teaching (e.g. outpatient sessions), group teaching (e.g. sessions for continuous medical education, journal club, multi-disciplinary meetings), self-directed learning, and apprenticeship for practical skills. During the training program, the fellow is required to complete one research project and to publish a minimum of one paper as first author in a recognized local journal (eg Malaysian Journal of Dermatology).

Paediatric dermatology fellows will be exposed to a large and diverse yet well-balanced paediatric population with diseases ranging from routine cases to highly complex inpatient and outpatient consultations. The core disease that they will be trained in are inflammatory diseases like atopic dermatitis, psoriasis, skin infections, acne, neonatal dermatoses, skin tumours, vascular anomalies, genodermatoses, hair and nail diseases. They will also learn to provide holistic and comprehensive care to the child and family taking into account not only the medical aspect but also the emotional and psychosocial aspect and impact of the illness on the child and family. Additionally they will learn how to manage complex paediatric dermatology patients in a multidisciplinary team and how

to coordinate care amongst the different specialties in the best interest of the child.

It is hope that the expansion of this program will produce more paediatric dermatologists to cater for the needs of the children in Malaysia especially in the government setting.

My Journey in Paediatric Dermatology: Clinical Fellowship in GOSH London

Greetings! I'm Henrietta, a pediatric dermatologist at Sarawak General Hospital, and I'm thrilled to share my experience of fellowship training abroad. As part of our subspecialty training in pediatric dermatology, we are required to complete the final year at an overseas center.

I had the incredible opportunity to undertake a clinical fellowship in pediatric dermatology at the **Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH) for Children in London, United Kingdom**. This hospital is a global leader in child healthcare and ranks among the top five children's hospitals worldwide. With over 67 specialized services dedicated to the care of sick children, GOSH offers the widest range of pediatric care in the UK, including pediatric dermatology.

During my fellowship, I worked in both the wards and clinics, managing various skin conditions under the supervision of experienced consultants. The paediatric dermatology team at GOSH deals with conditions similar to those we encounter in Malaysia, such as severe eczema, various birthmarks, vascular anomalies, psoriasis, allergies, genetic skin diseases and others. Most patients are referred by primary care physicians and general practitioners all across London. GOSH's advanced technology, particularly its well-established genetics lab, enables genetic and molecular confirmation for a majority of genodermatoses cases including cutaneous mosaicism. Research is a key focus at GOSH, and patients are frequently enrolled in various studies and clinical trials as part of the effort to better understand their conditions or to find better treatment options.

A striking advantage of GOSH compared to ours here is its robust multidisciplinary approach to patient care, particularly when dealing with complex cases. I was particularly impressed by the Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB) team, which includes two consultants, research fellows, EB-specialist nurses responsible for home visits and wound care education, a dedicated dietitian, a psychologist, an occupational therapist, a physiotherapist, and specialists from pediatric surgery and dental surgery as needed. EB patients receive continuous support from the team, and a strong network of mutual support exists among patients and their families. In chronic and debilitating conditions like EB, such a support system is vital for the well-being of both patients and their loved ones. Complex vascular anomalies like PHACES syndrome, Klippel-Trenaunay syndrome, and extensive vascular malformations are similarly managed with input from various subspecialties and supporting staff.

During my fellowship, I also attended the European Society of Paediatric Dermatology (ESPD) Congress in Munich, Germany, where I had the privilege of listening to renowned pediatric dermatologists and specialists from across Europe discuss the latest clinical and scientific developments. It was an honor to hear Professor Dr. Rudolf Happle speak about his pioneering work in cutaneous mosaicism, which was truly eye-opening. Overall, my time at GOSH has significantly enhanced my clinical knowledge and broadened my experience in pediatric dermatology.

Fellowship in Paediatric Dermatology at the Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne, Australia – An invaluable experience

The paediatric dermatology subspecialty training program is a 3-year program conducted by the Ministry of Health, Malaysia, and requires a candidate to have exposure and training in an established paediatric dermatology centre abroad in their final year. I was fortunate to be given the opportunity to complete my training as an honorary fellow at the **Department of Dermatology at the Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) in Melbourne, Australia**, under the supervision of Associate Professor David Orchard and Dr Susan Robertson. Associate Professor David Orchard was the Director of Dermatology at the Royal Children's Hospital and associate professor (clinical) at the University of Melbourne.

I was in Melbourne for 9 months, from February 2022 till November 2022 during which time I attended all the paediatric dermatology clinics and was involved in the management of both inpatients and outpatients at RCH. I also attended the vascular anomaly clinics at RCH, led by paediatric plastic and reconstructive surgeon Professor Anthony Penington. I was also fortunate to be able to join multidisciplinary and specialized dermatology clinics at the Royal Melbourne Hospital (RMH), like the acne clinic, genodermatosis clinic, porphyria clinic, epidermolysis bullosa clinic, vascular anomaly clinic and autoimmune and connective tissue disorder clinics. During the fellowship, I was trained in the use of various laser devices for

different dermatological conditions in children and adolescents, and there was also exposure to patch testing, office-based sclerotherapy for superficial vascular malformations, as well as botulinum toxin injections for axillary hyperhidrosis.

Furthermore, I had the opportunity to be involved in various educational and research activities including participation in multidisciplinary vascular anomaly meetings and I also presented cases during nationwide clinical meetings.

My fellowship at RCH was educational, enlightening and a truly invaluable experience, where I not only gained more knowledge and skills but built lasting friendships and precious connections. I hope to be able to share my experience and knowledge in helping my patients and in advancing education in paediatric dermatology locally among my colleagues in paediatrics and in general practice.

Finally, I would like to thank my supervisors Dr Sabeera Begum and Dr Leong Kin Fon for their guidance and teaching and my colleagues in the paediatric dermatology unit at Hospital Tunku Azizah, Kuala Lumpur for their support. My journey to become a paediatric dermatologist was possible due to the support from my family at work and my family at home, for which I will be forever grateful.

Reflections on My Fellowship in Dermatologic Surgery at Siriraj Hospital

Completing my fellowship in dermatologic surgery at Siriraj Hospital, from July 1, 2023, to July 31, 2024, under the guidance of world renowned dermatologic surgeon, Professor Dr. Woraphaong Manuskiatti and Professor Dr. Rungsima Wanitphakdeedecha, has been a pivotal chapter in my professional journey. This year-long experience not only deepened my expertise in dermatologic surgery and aesthetics but also opened doors to advanced research, international collaboration, and multidisciplinary practice.

About the Dermatology Department, Siriraj Hospital

Siriraj Hospital, under the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Mahidol University, boasts the largest dermatology department in Thailand. With over 30 dermatologists specializing in various fields, including photobiology, dermatologic surgery, nail and hair disorders, contact dermatitis, immunodermatology, dermatopathology, cutaneous lymphoma, granuloma, psoriasis, eczema, and vitiligo, the department provides a comprehensive approach to dermatologic care.

I was fortunate to occasionally visit these subspecialty clinics, gaining insights into their operations. The department's integration of point-of-care testing in its in-house lab, including KOH skin scrapings, Tzanck smears, Demodex mite identification, and RPR testing, is particularly impressive. The in-house lab also handles Mohs and hair processing, offering a complete and efficient diagnostic service. This experience highlighted the importance of advanced laboratory services in enhancing clinical practice, something I hope to bring back to my home country.

Scope of the Fellowship

The fellowship at Siriraj was comprehensive, covering a wide range of dermatologic surgery practices, including oncology surgery such as Mohs micrographic surgery, reconstruction with flaps and grafts, hair and nail surgery, and extensive aesthetic procedures. These aesthetic procedures included fillers, biostimulators, threads, liposuction, toxins, and an array of laser and other energy-based technologies.

The training was structured into three main aspects: research, clinical practice, and international collaboration.

Research

Siriraj and its Laser Center are renowned for conducting multiple industry-sponsored clinical trials, allowing me to be at the forefront of innovation in dermatologic treatments. I was involved in research utilizing hybrid biostimulators for full-face and neck rejuvenation and participated in clinical trials involving energy-based devices such as the picosecond 755 nm laser for acne scars and the 1550/1927 nm laser for facial rejuvenation. One of the most significant opportunities was evaluating the safety and efficacy of the 1726 nm laser for acne vulgaris, the first of its kind in Asia. These experiences enriched my understanding of cutting-edge treatments and their application in clinical settings.

Clinical Practice

In terms of clinical training, I participated in over twenty hands-on workshops covering various fillers, threads, biostimulators, toxins, and dermatologic surgeries. The fellowship placed a strong emphasis on anatomy knowledge, which is fundamental in preventing complications during dermatologic procedures. I attended over 15 cadaver workshops, which were instrumental in enhancing my understanding of facial structures, significantly improving my surgical and aesthetic precision and outcomes.



International Collaboration

One of the highlights of my fellowship was the one-month observership in dermatologic surgery at Severance Hospital, Yonsei University. Under the mentorship of Professor Kee-Yang Chung, a world-renowned dermatologic surgeon, I gained invaluable experience in complex surgeries and reconstruction. His expertise in managing melanoma, extramammary Paget's disease, and soft tissue sarcomas across various anatomical sites was particularly enlightening. Observing the collaborative efforts of multidisciplinary teams, including colorectal, plastic, and urological surgeons, in treating these cancers reinforced the importance of teamwork in achieving optimal patient outcomes. Professor Chung's proficiency in utilizing fat grafts for treating autoimmune disorders such as Parry-Romberg syndrome, morphea, and lupus panniculitis was eye-opening. The ability to address inflammation while correcting disfiguring atrophic conditions dramatically improved patients' quality of life, an approach I found particularly inspiring.

Networking and Conferences

Siriraj Hospital is also deeply involved in the international aesthetic community, organizing and participating in various international conferences. This provided me with unparalleled networking opportunities, connecting with professionals from Australia, United States, Singapore, Indonesia, Philippines, Vietnam, India, Taiwan, China, Korea, and Cambodia. Many of these connections have continued beyond the fellowship, opening avenues for future research and collaboration.

Acknowledgment

I am deeply grateful for the financial support from Universiti Putra Malaysia and my colleagues at Central Dermatology Specialist Clinic throughout this year. I also extend my heartfelt thanks to my wife, parents, and children, who endured the emotional challenges of my frequent travels.

Future Plans

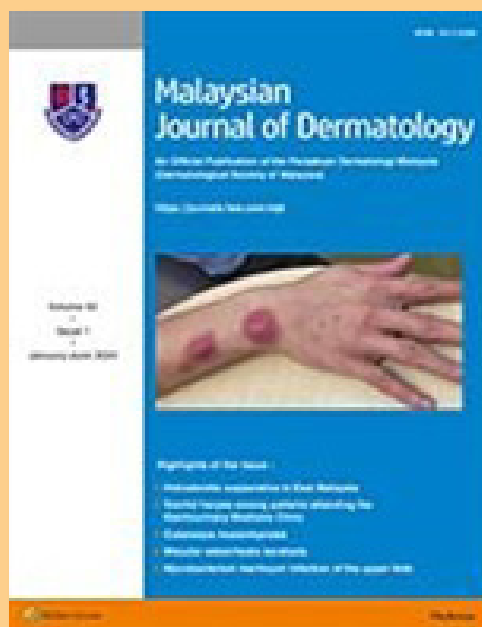
Looking ahead, my goal is to elevate the knowledge and skills in both aesthetic and dermatologic surgery among our dermatologists. I plan to conduct workshops and conferences to provide platforms for learning and skill enhancement. The Asia Master Course in Cosmetic and Dermatologic Surgery (AMCADS), organized on August 24-25, 2024, was the first step in this direction. I am currently in discussions with the education center at Universiti Putra Malaysia and industry partners to offer certification and postgraduate diploma programs. Additionally, Hospital Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah will be the first center to offer affordable aesthetic services, providing a training ground for future dermatologic surgeons.

In conclusion, my fellowship at Siriraj Hospital was a transformative experience that expanded my clinical expertise, deepened my research involvement, and strengthened my international connections. The skills, knowledge, and relationships I have cultivated during this time will undoubtedly shape my future practice, enabling me to deliver the highest standard of care to my patients and contribute to the growth of our dermatologic community. As the saying goes, "No one can whistle a symphony. It takes a whole orchestra to play it!" I look forward to collaborating with like-minded dermatologists to achieve even greater things.

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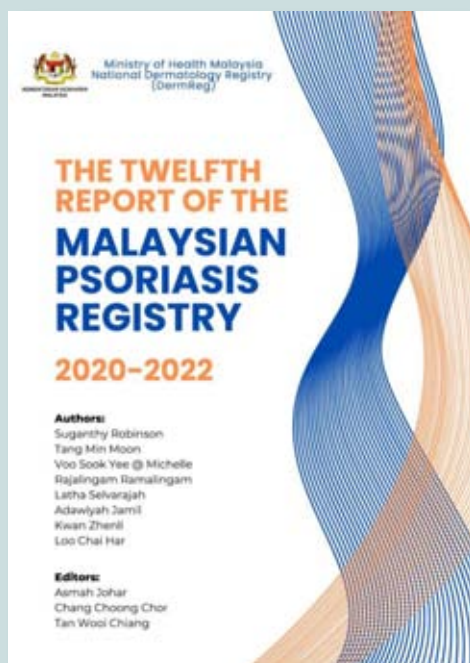

MPR activities for 2023/2024

- a) A joint governance board and steering committee meeting was held on 14.9.2023 at Amari SPICE Penang Hotel.
- b) At present, a total of 39 centers contribute data to the registry which includes 34 government centres, 3 private centres and 2 universities. University and private dermatologists are strongly encouraged to contribute so that the registry may accurately represent psoriasis patients in Malaysia.
- c) For 2023/2024, the MPR produced 'The Twelfth Report of the Malaysian Psoriasis Registry 2020-2022', published 2 manuscripts in peer reviewed journals and presented 2 posters at local and international conferences. These publications are available at <http://www.dermatology.org.my/DermReg/publications.html>.
- d) We encourage the use of our data for clinical management, policy making, resource planning and publications. Data request guidelines and forms can be obtained from <http://www.dermatology.org.my/DermReg/datarequest.html>.
- e) The MPR funds have been moved to an account under 'Kelab Dermatologi KL' under the care of the Dermatology Department of Hospital Kuala Lumpur at the request of the PDM EXCO.
- f) The Malaysian Pustular Psoriasis Registry (a sub registry under the MPR) is expected to start data collection in 2025 and is in the process of obtaining ethical approval from the Medical Review & Ethics Committee (MREC), Ministry of Health Malaysia.

Activities by the Psoriasis Association of Malaysia (PAM) from Aug 2023 – Jul 2024

The year has been marked by significant progress, resilience and new pathways as we continue our mission to support those affected by psoriasis and psoriatic arthritis, advocate for their needs, and enhance awareness of this chronic condition.

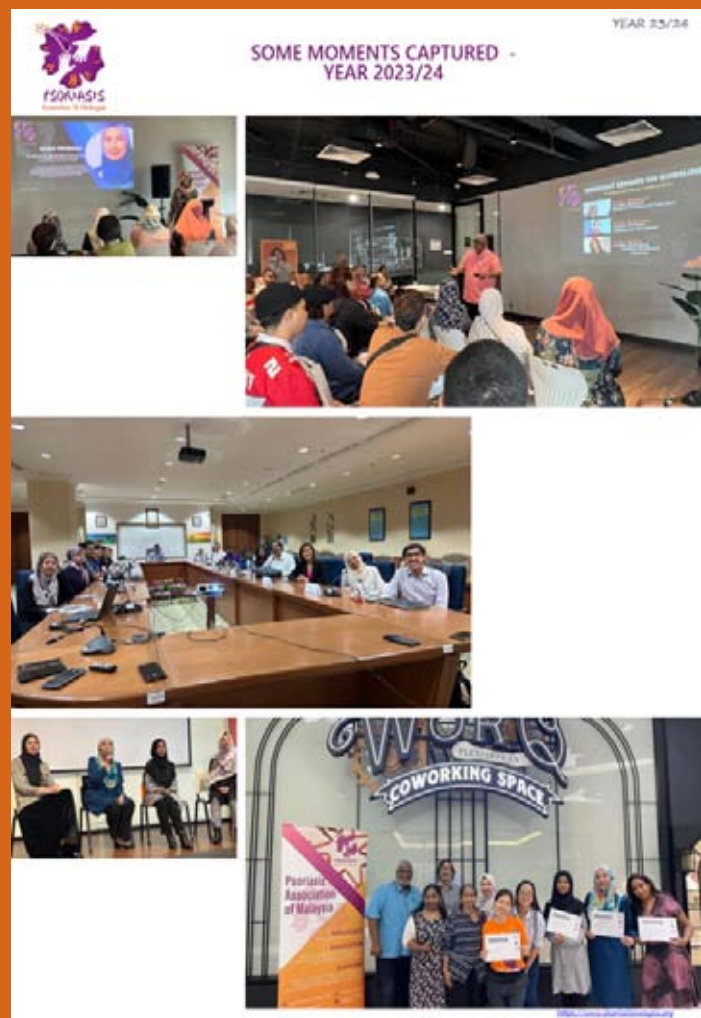
We continued to make remarkable strides in raising awareness about psoriasis and reducing the stigma associated with the condition by organizing activities to engage with the community. We organized, for the first time, an educational activity on psoriasis among school children, which provided valuable information on psoriasis and early exposure to the kids to reduce the stigma associated with the disease.

We expanded our digital outreach, utilizing social media to connect with a broader audience, ensuring that no one feels alone in their journey with psoriasis. A video podcast project, funded by 2 pharmaceutical companies, entitled *Beyond the Surface: The Psoriasis Podcast* was undertaken in December 2023 and ready for viewing in May 2024. It is hoped this series of podcasts will reach out to more people thereby enhancing their awareness about psoriasis.

We continued to advocate, in partnership with other non-governmental organisations, for better healthcare policies and access to affordable and effective treatments. We have appealed to the Employee Provident Fund to include psoriasis as one of the critical illnesses whereby contributors are able to apply for partial withdrawal to cover medical expenses. We also strengthened our collaborations with both local and international organizations, enhancing our capacity to influence global psoriasis initiatives and research. The heart of our association remains the support we provide to the psoriatic community. During the course of the year, we organised a number of events designed not only for educational purposes but also to foster a sense of community and shared experience among members and the public. The activities conducted are summarized in the following table.

4 Oct 2023	Creating awareness in School SJK (T) Fletcher, Kuala Lumpur The goal of the campaign is to educate, raise awareness, and foster empathy, incorporate moral virtues. Creating a campaign that not only educates but also inspires positive behavior change and understanding. A talk on psoriasis & incorporating moral virtues was given to students in commemoration of World Psoriasis Day 2023. A free skin consultation was also organised at the same event by medical personnel from Hospital Kuala Lumpur.
15 Oct 2023	Mental Health Forum – In conjunction of Mental Health Month For the 1st time, Mental Illness Awareness and Support Association (MIASA) have collaborated with PAM for raising awareness.
29 Oct 2023	World Psoriasis Day 2023. It was celebrated with much fanfare at the Kuala Lumpur Gateway Mall. The event was officiated by Dato Dr Mohd Azman Yacob, Director of Medical Development Division, Ministry of Health, Malaysia. Several activities were organized- including photography exhibition, dance performances, specialist talks and skin clinics - to highlight public awareness on psoriasis. On this day, we have launched 2024 calendar, portraying 12 psoriasis warriors as part of the “All the Color We Are” project. This is also part of the awareness and fund raising initiative.
10 Dec 2023	A video/podcast project - funded by 2 pharmaceutical companies - on <i>Beyond the Surface: The Psoriasis Podcast</i> was recorded. It is hoped this series of podcasts will reach out to more people, thereby enhancing their awareness about psoriasis.
12 Dec 2023	The association has been invited to be part of the forum, entitled: Universal Health Coverage Day - Health for All : Time for Action- How? Obtaining Perspectives of Stakeholders and launching of Health Indicators for & By people living with NCDs – A community guide.
9 March 2024	Scalp Psoriasis for Hairdressers & Patients Workshop. Participants were enlightened on the pivotal role of hairdressers in uplifting the spirits of psoriatic individuals. Dr. Raoul Siebert, Deputy Director of Health Services, Department of Health, Federal Territory of Putrajaya, underscored this role by emphasizing that hairdressers serve as advocates for their clients’ overall well-being. Dr. Moonyza Akmal, a consultant dermatologist at Hospital Kuala Lumpur, presented on scalp psoriasis at the workshop.
10 May 2024	The Ministry of Health (MOH) has invited the Psoriasis Association of Malaysia (PAM) and other NGOs related to non-communicable diseases (NCDs) for an engagement meeting. The main purpose of this meeting is to understand the roles of each participating NCD organization before preparing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between MOH and the NGOs involved.
16 May 2024	Boehringer Ingelheim (BI) invited PAM to participate in their Value Through Innovation (VTI) Day to collaborate on effectively utilizing social media. BI also invited influencers from SAYS to guide their staff on creating reels using patient stories and information.
26 May 2024	GPP Navigator Program. PAM launched a GPP patient support program to assist newly diagnosed GPP patients. PAM together with medical professionals have trained the “Navigators” on the disease, management and mental health support. Presently, there are at least 15 Navigators who will be able to reach out to GPP patients across Malaysia to support them on this lifelong journey of a very difficult condition.
24-30 June 2024	IFPA Conference & Members meeting. Sofia Lovi represented the International Federation of Psoriasis Associations (IFPA) at this year’s meeting in Stockholm, Sweden. The event featured the 6th World Scientific Program, where renowned dermatologists from around the globe presented their lectures, followed by a members’ meeting. Additionally, Sofia has been selected as an IFPA Ambassador this year. She will also be attending training sessions organized by IFPA and will work closely on advocacy initiatives in her new role. 2. Empowering Families: A Half-Day Event for Children with Epidermolysis Bullosa and Their Caregivers

On a bright and hopeful morning, families and caregivers of children with Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB) gathered for a transformative half-day event designed to provide both education and hands-on experience. The wound management station was particularly impactful. Clinicians demonstrated techniques for dressing different types of EB wounds, emphasizing the importance of gentle handling and the use of appropriate materials to minimize pain and prevent infections. Parents and caregivers had the opportunity to practice these techniques under the guidance of experienced nurses, gaining confidence in their ability to manage their children's care at home.

Another crucial station focused on dental care, an often-overlooked aspect of EB management. Dental specialists provided tips on maintaining oral hygiene and preventing dental issues, which can be particularly challenging for children with EB due to their fragile mucous membranes. The hands-on demonstration included advice on selecting the right dental products and techniques to ensure gentle care.

The final station offered a comprehensive overview of different dressings suitable for various wound types.



Clinicians discussed the benefits and limitations of each dressing type, providing personalized recommendations based on individual cases. This interactive session allowed parents to ask specific questions and receive tailored advice, ensuring they left with practical knowledge directly applicable to their daily routines.

As the event drew to a close, the sense of camaraderie and support among attendees was palpable. Families expressed gratitude for the opportunity to learn and connect with others facing similar challenges. The event not only equipped them with essential skills but also fostered a supportive community, reinforcing that they are not alone in their journey.

In conclusion, the half-day event was a resounding success, offering a blend of education, practical training, and emotional support. It highlighted the importance of empowering caregivers with knowledge and skills to improve the quality of life for children with Epidermolysis Bullosa. Paediatric Dermatology Unit Hospital Tunku Azizah remains committed to supporting these families and looks forward to hosting more such events in the future.
