



## Message from the **PRESIDENT**

Dear members, colleagues, and friends,

First and foremost, I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to my **Executive Committee** for their unwavering commitment and support throughout this journey. Each member has contributed wholeheartedly, and together we have worked tirelessly towards advancing the society. My sincere appreciation also goes to the **Past Presidents' Council** for their invaluable guidance and expert advice, with special thanks to **Dr. Sabeera Begum**, who has been my reference and mentor.

**The objectives of PDM remain clear — to promote continuous medical education, foster training and research, strengthen collaboration and networking, and to uphold our advocacy role.** Over the past year, we have made meaningful progress in these areas through a series of impactful activities, events organized and initiatives. Among the highlights:

### A. Education

PDM has actively organised dermatology updates and seminars, both in-person and virtually. Members spearheaded numerous educational initiatives for dermatologists, trainees, medical officers, and allied health personnel, including:

- **PDM Midterm Meeting 2025 on Laser & Energy-based Devices**
- **Northern Dermatology Summit**
- **Borneo Dermatology Update**
- **Immunodermatology Updates**
- **Updates in Contact Dermatitis**
- **Wound & Scar Masterclass**

In collaboration with the pharmaceutical sector, PDM has also organised masterclasses (Psoriasis, Atopic Eczema, Immunology), expert consensus workshops on skincare regimens, and a wide range of virtual lectures/webinars on conditions such as GPP, CSU, AD, and psoriasis.

The **PDM website ([dermatology.org.my](http://dermatology.org.my))** continues to be a valuable resource with sections like "News & Events" and "For Professionals", featuring guidelines, protocols, and scientific presentations.

**Under the leadership of Dr. Henry Foong and Dr. Leong Kin Fon**, the Dermatology Chapter has also been actively contributing to continuous medical education via webinars, workshops, and conferences.

### B. Research & Publications

- **Research Grants:** PDM champions research through the PDM Research Grant, complemented by the MSF Grant to support dermatologists in research.
- **Malaysian Journal of Dermatology (MJD):** Since 2024, MJD has transitioned to a digital format with Wolters Kluwer Medknow. This advancement aims to attract more submissions, improve visibility, and eventually secure indexing status.
- **Clinical Guidelines & Publications:** PDM is actively engaged in the development and review of position papers and evidence-based clinical practice guidelines (CPGs), as well as the endorsement of expert consensus statements pertaining to dermatological diseases and skin health.

  - National Vaccine-Preventable Diseases Recommendations for Older Persons in Malaysia 2025 by Malaysian Society of Geriatric Medicine

### C. Collaboration (International & Local)

- **International Leagues of Dermatological Societies (ILDS):** PDM members contributed to ILDS newsletters (2023/24) and the society was invited to attend the World Skin Summit 2025.
- **Leagues of Asian Dermatological Societies (LADS):** Hosted the 26<sup>th</sup> RCD at KLCC (2–5 Oct 2024) with the **LADS AGM** attended by seven Asian societies.
- **AADV & ALDS:** Strengthened ties with Asian dermatology networks for collaboration and knowledge exchange.
- **SPIN & IRASPEN:** Through the National Psoriasis Registry, PDM contributes to these global psoriasis networks, sharing data, expertise, and educational resources.

- **Ministry of Health (MOH):** Collaborated on workshops (Leprosy, STI, Dermatology Nursing, Fellowship training). Notable initiatives include: Dermatology-Rheumatology Masterclass (led by Dr. Teeba Raja), Scar & Wound Masterclass 2025 in Penang, co-organised with national wound, orthopaedic, and plastic surgery teams.
- **National University of Malaysia (UKM):** Continued support for the Advanced Master in Dermatology training programme.
- **Networking & Partnerships:** Strengthening ties with regional and international societies to foster knowledge exchange and professional collaboration.

**D. Advocacy & Public Engagement:** The PDM is also committed in raising public awareness regarding skin health and skin diseases.

- **National Skin Health Day 2025:** Held in Penang (19 July 2025), attended by over 1,200 participants. Activities included serial lectures on acne, eczema, skin infection, skincare workshops, skin consultation, prick tests, wet-wrap demonstration, booth exhibitions, and pharmacist-led Know Your Medicine sessions.
- **Patient & Public Awareness:** PDM supported awareness campaigns for **World Psoriasis Day**, **World Eczema Day**, **World Leprosy Day & EB Awareness Week**.
- Engagement in patient education campaigns and collaboration with stakeholders to advocate for better access to dermatological care.
- The Executive Committee & members also actively participated in educating public on common skin disorders and skin care through writing articles in **mainstream media**. Media Publications (radio/TV interview/newspaper/magazine/social media/etc).

### E. CSR & Humanitarian Dermatology Projects

- **Patient Support Groups:** Ongoing collaboration with DEBRA Malaysia, Ichthyosis Association, Psoriasis Association and Persatuan Ekzema Malaysia offering technical and financial support.
- **Project Adolescent Skin Health (PASH):** Initiated in 2018, continued through 2025 across multiple states, engaging students and teachers.
- **Community Outreach:** Projects for leprosy, psoriasis, EB and others at aborigine settlements, factories, health carnival and rural villages.
- **Patient Education:** Comic on Alopecia Areata (3 languages) in collaboration with Pfizer & Digital initiative on Chronic Spontaneous Urticaria in collaboration with Novartis.

This past year has been truly inspiring, marked by teamwork, innovation and shared purpose. None of it would have been possible without the dedication of our members and the collective spirit that drives PDM forward.

## 26<sup>th</sup> Regional Conference of Dermatology 2024

In 2024, after a 14-year wait, PDM proudly hosted the **26th Regional Conference of Dermatology (RCD)** from **2-5 October** at the **Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC)**. Organised in collaboration with several leading local and international societies — including the **League of ASEAN Dermatological Societies (LADS)**, **Asian Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AADV)**, **Asian Society of Dermatopathology (ASD)**, **International Psoriasis Council (IPC)**, and the **College of Physicians, Academy of Medicine Malaysia** — the event brought together over a thousand participants (Total of 1032 delegates) from across the globe for four days of scientific exchange, innovation and networking.

The scientific agenda showcased the latest breakthroughs, innovative medical technology and skill updates in medical and cosmetic dermatology, paediatric dermatology, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, and emerging technologies. **Across 5 pre-congress workshops, 33 symposiums, and 6 plenary lectures, 42 international and 38 local experts shared insights on cutting-edge science and clinical best practices.** PDM also received **285 e-posters and 18 free papers**, highlighting original research from across the region.

Another highlight of the conference was the **FAADV Fellowship Conferment Ceremony** held on the final day — a momentous occasion recognising excellence, dedication, and contribution to the field of dermatology. This prestigious honour, awarded by the **Asian Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AADV)**, symbolises the highest level of professional achievement and commitment to advancing skin health in Asia.

In this memorable ceremony, **30 Malaysian dermatologists** proudly received the Fellowship of the Asian Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (FAADV). The recognition not only celebrated their individual accomplishments in clinical practice, research, and education, but also underscored Malaysia's growing influence and leadership in the regional dermatology community. The atmosphere was one of pride, camaraderie and inspiration — marking a fitting finale to four days of world-class scientific exchange and collaboration.

The LADS Council Meeting was also held during the conference, attended by representatives from all member countries, further strengthening regional collaboration and unity within the dermatology community.

## Pre-Congress Workshop RCDKL: Botulinum toxin and fillers Hands on workshop

The **Pre-Congress Hands-on Workshop on Botulinum Toxin and Fillers** was indeed a key event during the **26th Regional Congress of Dermatology (RCDKL)**, held on **October 2, 2024**, at **Hospital Tunku Azizah in Kuala Lumpur**. This workshop was organized to offer **practical training** for doctors to improve or refine their skills in administering **botulinum toxin** and **dermal fillers**—two key treatments in cosmetic dermatology.

### Event Breakdown:

- **Morning Sessions (Fillers Focus):** The day began with insightful **lectures** on dermal fillers by **Dr. Peter Ch'ng** and **Dr. Tanongkiet** from Thailand. Their talks covered:
  - The latest techniques in dermal filler injections for facial contouring, volume restoration and skin booster.
  - Patient selection and managing complications.

This was followed by a **hands-on workshop** where attendees practiced techniques on volunteers under expert supervision.

- **Afternoon Sessions (Botulinum Toxin Focus):** After lunch, **Dr. Peter Ch'ng** gave another detailed lecture, this time focusing on **botulinum toxin** (often referred to as Botox), its applications, and safety measures in aesthetic treatments such as wrinkle reduction and facial rejuvenation.

This was followed by a **second hands-on workshop** on **botulinum toxin injections**, facilitated by **Dr. Patrick Huang** from Taiwan and **Dr. Peter Ch'ng**. During this session, attendees had the opportunity to inject botulinum

toxin injections on **volunteers**, getting hands-on experience under expert guidance.

### Participant Attendance:

- **37 participants** attended the **fillers workshop**
- **34 participants** attended the **botulinum toxin workshop**.

This combination of **lectures** and **hands-on training** offered participants a comprehensive experience, blending theoretical knowledge with practical application. We also managed to generate net income of RM56,800 for PDM through this workshop.



## RCD 2024 Pre-Congress Workshop RCDKL: Modern Genetics in Genodermatoses

As part of the 26th Regional Congress of Dermatology, a pre-congress workshop on modern genetics in genodermatoses took place on October 2, 2024, at Hospital Tunku Azizah in Kuala Lumpur, one day before the main event. The workshop attracted a diverse group of participants, including local and international delegates, all focusing on genetic skin disorders.

The distinguished international panel included dermatology experts Dr. Leong Kin Fon from Malaysia, Professor Tay Yong Kwong from Singapore, Professor Sandipan Dhar from India and consultant clinical geneticist from Malaysia, Dr. Winnie Ong. The faculty of speakers presented a variety of clinical cases on genodermatoses, organized into sessions covering topics such as erythrodermic and scaly conditions, epidermolysis bullosa, ectodermal dysplasias, autoinflammatory syndromes, and mosaic skin disorders.

Participants gained valuable insights into practical approaches for managing genodermatoses and the critical role of genotype-phenotype correlation. This collaborative effort between dermatology and genetics professionals will undoubtedly serve as a foundation for future workshops.



## Advanced Master in Dermatology Programme Report Sept 2025

### AdvMDerm

One hundred and forty (140) dermatologists have been produced by the AdvMDerm programme since 2022. Thirty-five students (35) are currently enrolled. Sixteen are in their final year, ten will be sitting for their examinations in December 2025 and six in June 2026. There are eight candidates in the Dec 2023 – Dec 2026 batch, and eleven in the Dec 2024 – Dec 2027 batch.

### New intake

The 25<sup>th</sup> batch of the AdvMDerm enrolled into the programme on 1<sup>st</sup> Dec 2024. They were Dr. Aminuddin bin Hasnol Aidi, Dr. Chan Gin Peng, Dr. Benedict Sachdev a/l Manjit Singh, Dr. Ng Ling Fong, Dr. Goh Shiau Fui, Dr. Mohd Arif Abdul Malik Khiew, Dr. Sangeetha a/p Magason, Dr. Dalleen Leong Pei Chin, Dr. Mah Tsing Yee, Dr. Nurul Izzah binti Aziz and Dr. Ooi Bai Han.

### Examination

The last examination saw fourteen candidates sitting for the examination at the Department of Medicine, Hospital Canselor Tuanku Muhriz, Faculty of Medicine, University Kebangsaan Malaysia from 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025. Dr. Lim Jo Anne scored the highest overall marks, and she will be receiving the PDM Best Student 2025 award. We would like to thank the esteemed examiners Datin Dr Asmah Johar, Prof. Dr. Richard Barlow, Dr. Nazatul Shima Abdul Rahim and Dr. Ng Fei Yin for their commitment, expertise and hard work. ## Perak Paediatric Dermatology Update in May 2025

This event was organized by Paediatric Dermatology Unit of Paediatric Department, Hospital Raja Permaisuri Bainun and Paediatric Dermatology Subcommittee, Persatuan Dermatologi Malaysia and held in HRPB, Ipoh.

The Perak Paediatric Dermatology Update 2025 was organized to enhance the knowledge and clinical skills of healthcare professionals managing skin conditions in children. This event brought together medical practitioners from diverse backgrounds to share insights, practical updates, and best practices in paediatric dermatology.

A total of 118 paediatric specialists and medical officers from within Perak state, family medicine specialists, dermatology trainees, private general practitioners and allied healthcare professionals (e.g., nurses and medical assistants) from government and private attended the course.

This one-day course featured a series of morning lectures and afternoon workshops covering the following key topics:

- 1) Atopic dermatitis
- 2) Food allergies
- 3) Contact dermatitis in children
- 4) Infantile Haemangioma

- 5) Skin infection in children
- 6) Neonatal dermatoses
- 7) Common drug rash in children
- 8) Sharing of interesting cases in Paediatric dermatology clinic
- 9) Afternoon workshop and hands-on on wet wrap therapy, eczema education, prick therapy/KOH application for molluscum contagiosum, wound dressing.

Speakers included experienced paediatric dermatologists and dermatologists. Participants actively engaged in Q&A sessions workshops. Post-event feedback was collected online. 90% rated the overall course as excellent or very good. Participants valued the clarity of presentations, practical relevance, and quality of visual material and suggested extending the course to two days and conducting it regularly/annually.



## Sarawak Paediatric Dermatology Update (SPDU) in July 2025

This event was organized by Paediatric Dermatology Unit of Paediatric Department and Dermatology Department, Sarawak General Hospital and Paediatric Dermatology Sub-committee of Persatuan Dermatologi Malaysia and held in Imperial Hotel Kuching, Sarawak.

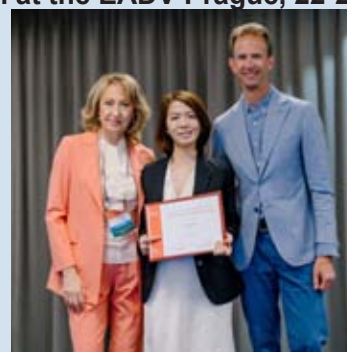
### Stress Management and Soft Skills Course

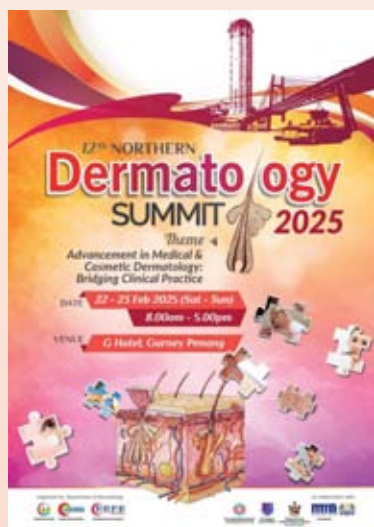

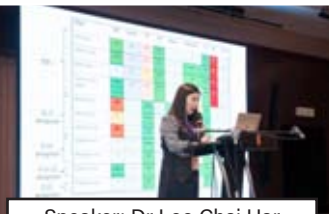

## Wound & Scar Masterclass 2025

Date: 24<sup>th</sup> February 2025

Venue: G Hotel, Gurney Penang

A one-day intensive masterclass designed to elevate clinical proficiency in wound / dressing management and scar management. The programme brought together a multidisciplinary team including wound specialists, wound care teams, orthopedic surgeons, plastic surgeons, physiotherapist / occupational therapist and dermatologists. This integrated team approach allowed participants to explore holistic patient care strategies and to understand how different specialties contribute to wound and scar management.

### Morning Session: Wound Diagnosis & Management

#### A. Lectures:

The masterclass commenced with a series of structured lectures focused on accurate wound diagnosis and evidence-based management approaches. Topics covered included wound assessment techniques, infection risk evaluation, and appropriate dressing selection.

#### B. Breakout Practical Session:

Participants then engaged in hands-on breakout sessions designed to refine practical skills in wound cleansing, debridement, and dressing application. Emphasis was placed on real-world case scenarios, enabling teams to collaborate and apply theoretical knowledge in tactile, supervised settings.

### Afternoon Session: Scar Management - Laser & Energy-Based Device

The afternoon began with expert-led presentations on the principles, indications, and safety protocols associated with laser and energy-based devices for scar treatment.

Participants rotated through practical stations, gaining direct experience with:

- Cryosurgery
- CO<sub>2</sub> Laser
- PicoLaser
- Microneedling Radiofrequency

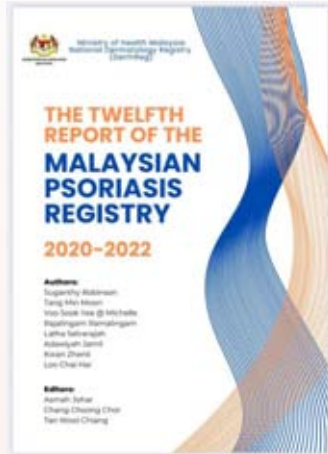

MPR activities for 2024/2025

## Malaysian Journal of Dermatology



Since June 2024, the Malaysian Journal of Dermatology (MJD) has been published by Wolters Kluwer Medknow. MJD is the official peer-reviewed publication of Persatuan Dermatologi Malaysia (Dermatological Society of Malaysia) and is published twice yearly (June and December issue). The journal is available for reading online via the MJD website at <https://journals.lww.com/mjd/pages/default.aspx> while the submission platform is accessible at <https://review.jow.medknow.com/MJD>.

The journal has been indexed in the Western Pacific Research Index Medicus (WPRIM) since 2009 and is now registered with the following abstracting partners: Baidu Scholar, China National Knowledge Infrastructure (CNKI), EBSCO Publishing's Electronic Databases, Ex Libris – Primo Central, Google Scholar, Hinari, Infotrieve, National Science Library, ProQuest, TDNet and Wanfang Data.

Between August 2024 and August 2025, there have been two issues of the journal released on the website. The MJD published a range of submissions including review articles, original articles, case reports and correspondence. While featuring Malaysian research in the field of dermatology, the MJD also showcased work from regional authors including Singapore, India and Bangladesh.

Moving forward, we hope that our endeavours can promote and encourage dermatologists in Malaysia and the wider region to produce and publish their research on this public platform. We also eventually aim to index the MJD in the Scopus and Web of Science databases.

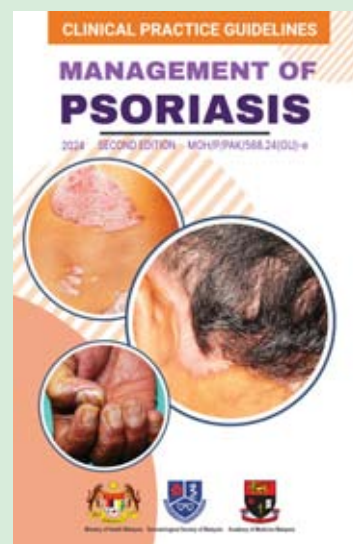
Key highlights include:
